THE NEED

The infrastructure of Jackson, MS (like many other HBCU neighborhoods across the nation) has been intentionally neglected due to white flight to the surrounding suburbs

"Empty lots and lots with abandoned structures on them make up 41% of the lots in West Jackson" (West Jackson Planning Guidebook, pg. 18)

"Jackson has struggled with safe water access for decades and has lacked the funding to implement change. THE IMPACT





Communal living is good for our staff. As our staff develop, they can develop student leaders. Each year we have seen the house become more and more like a student leadership spot which creates a lot of energy and momentum for the InterVarsity campus ministry.

We have gone from owing \$500k on our ministry home loan to only owing \$68k in five years by paying off approximately \$80k year through donations and rental income. Additionally, we have been able to give away \$30k a year to support our underfunded low networked staff since day one.



Combine charisma, strategic thinking, and compassion, and you have Andy Abrams. Although born and raised in Chicago, he intentionally moved to rural Mississippi in the mid-80s to raise his family on their inherited land. While serving as the Director of Family Development and Training with Voice of Calvary Ministries in Jackson, MS, Andy took on challenging responsibilities, such as training individuals to become first time homeowners.

He was a martial arts master, a dynamic speaker, a professional bible teacher, and a loving family man. His impressive business management background merged with the critical skills he acquired while mastering the game of chess enabled him to develop leaders efficiently and established quality partnerships throughout the city.

As he battled diabetes, kidney failure, and blindness - due to high blood pressure, Andy Abrams served as the Lead Pastor at Voice of Calvary Fellowship Church from 1999 until he passed away from health complications on March 13, 2003.

He loved to bake (and eat) German Chocolate cake, to read science fiction novels, and all things Star Trek.
